

Hamline University Undergraduate Transfer of Credit

Hamline Plan Alignment with Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC)

Transfer courses must be considered college level and relevant to a liberal arts degree, and a student must have earned a C- or above. Syllabi may be required to make a final determination regarding credit transfer.

¹ Students who transfer fewer than 64 semester credits are required to take two speaking-intensive courses. One speaking-intensive course can be transferred to Hamline; one must be taken at Hamline. Students transferring in as juniors (64 or more semester credits) are required to take only one speaking-intensive course, but it must be taken at Hamline.

² Students may complete one course in each category or a single course designated with both R and M.

³ Students must complete enough fine arts courses to equal eight credits.

First-year writing (E) or expository writing			
Writing intensive (W) Three writing-intensive courses are required. Two are provided within a student's major, one at the 1000- or 3000-level and one at the 5000-level. The third course can be completed through writing-intensive offerings in any area.			
Speaking intensive (O) At least one speaking intensive course must be completed at Hamline.

Fine arts (F) One- and two-credit fine arts courses either taken at Hamline or transferred must add up to 4 credits to fulfill one fine arts requirement and 8 credits to fulfill two requirements. An exception is made for 3-credit courses transferred to Hamline—the fourth credit does not have to be made up in those instances. Credits: 128 required for graduation (140 if pursuing a double degree), including AP, IB, PSEO, and transfer credits. Note that a minimum of 56 credits must be completed at Hamline University (52 graded A-F to graduate with Latin honors). Of the last 32 credits, 28 must be completed in residence at Hamline, within the ACTC exchange, or through Hamline-approved off-campus programs.
